Bal Gangadhar Tilak

Bal Gangadhar Tilak born Keshav Gangadhar Tilak 23 July 1856 Ratnagiri district, Bombay presidency, British India (Present Maharastra, India) to 1 August 1920 (aged 64) Bombay, Bombay presidency, British India (present day mumbai, maharastra, india), endeared as lokmanya, was an Indian nationalist, teacher and an independence activist. He was one third of the lal bal pal triumvirate.

Tilak was the first leader of the Indian independence movement. The British colonial authorities called him "The Father Of The Indian unrest". He was also conferred with the title of "Lokmanya", which means "Accepted by the people as their leader". Mahatma gandhi called him " The Maker Of Mordern India".

Tilak was one of the first and strongest advocates of swaraj (self-rule) and a strong radical in India consciousness. He is known for his quote in Marathi " Swaraj is my birth right and I shall have it!". He formed a close alliance with many indian national congress leaders including Bipin Chandra Paul, Lala Lajpat Rai, Aurobindo Ghose, V.O. Chidambaram Pillai and Muhammad Ali Jinnah.

Jumping Into The Freedom Cause

Tilak founded the Marathi Daily Kesari (lion) in 1880. in just two years 'Kesari' attracted more readers then any langusage news paper in India. The editorials gave a vivid pictured of the people's suffering and of actual happenings, they called upon every Indian to fight for his right. This was the objective that motivated Tilak and in what was reflected allegorically in the motto chosen by tilak for the kesari.

Tilak joined the indian national congress in the 1890's, but soon fall into opposite of it's libreal moderate attitude toward the fight for self government. As he matured as a national leader, he become all too aware of the importance of Hindu. Muslims unity in the freedom movement. As early as 1893, Tilak had become conscious of how conflicts between Hindus and Muslims came about at the instigation of Anglo-Indian officers in the colonial administration. He was not oblivious to the 'Divide and Rule' policy of the colonial administrations and knew how dertrimental that was to the cause of freedom.

In 1980, there were few leaders (Hindus, Muslims or Sikh) of comparable stature in the Indian freedom movement and in several ways Tilak's ideas remain for ahead of Gandhi's. Any lover of Indian freedom and progress would have to be cognizant of that. Tilak's writing on non voilance are especially revealing of an advanced intellect.

Tilak was neither a gun fetishish nor an idealist rejecter of voilance. In 1908, he saw non voilent resistance through mass civil disobedience as the preferred method of struggle only because he did not see the possibilities of winning on armed struggle against the British at the particular time.

But neither did he reject the possibility that a time may come when the Indian masses would be able ready and prepared for an armed struggle, if no other option of defeating the british seemed likely to succeed. For that reason, he was never prepared to condemn the armed revolutionaries and defended each one as a legitimate fighter and martyr in the cause of Indian independence.

Ahilya Bai Holkar

Ahilya Bai Holkar was hereditary noble queen of the Maratha empire in early morden India. She established Maheshwar. She was born on 31st May 1725. Her father name was Mankoji Shinde. her mother name was Sushila Shinde. She was a hindu.

After the demise of her husband Khande Rao Holkar and father in law Malhar Rao Holker, Ahilya bai herself under took the affairs of Holkar dynasty. She defended the Malwa state against intruders and personally led armies into battle, with Tukoji Rao Holkar as her military commander.

Ahilya bai was a great pioneer and builder of hindu temple who constructed hundreds of temples and dharmashalas throughout India. She is specially reowned for refurbishing and reconsecrating some of the most scared sites of hindu pilgrimage that had been desecreated and demolished in the revious century by the Mughal emperor Aurangzeb one such Kasi Vishwanath temple.

As a token of recognation for the service she rendered to the nation a university and airport is named after her which is Devi Ahilya Vishwa vidyalaya in Indore, Madhya Pradesh and Punyashlok Ahilya Devi Holkar Solapur University in Solapur, Maharashtra.
